This distribution includes a 'Fund Payment' of 1.42825 cents per unit pursuant to Subdivision 12-H of Schedule 1 of the Taxation Administration Act 1953 ('the Act'), in respect of the income year ended 30 June 2026. The components of the distribution are provided solely for the purposes of determining managed investment trust ('MIT') non-resident withholding tax under Subdivisions 12-H and Division 12A of the Act.

The portion of the fund payment amount for the quarter ended 30 June 2026 which is attributable from a clean building managed investment trust is 0.01041 cents per unit.

The Cromwell Phoenix Property Securities Fund is a withholding managed investment trust for the purposes of Subdivision 12-H of the Act.

The components are estimates only and should not be used for any other purpose. In particular, Australian resident unitholders should not rely on this notice for the purposes of completing income tax returns. Details of the full year components of distributions will be provided in the 2026 Attribution MIT Member Annual ('AMMA') Statement.
